# Making the Most Of What you Already Have



### General

- Neatness will overcome dated carpet, color of the paint and age of the roof.
- When a home does not have clutter, the buyer's reaction is that the home is clean, well maintained and of the highest quality.
- If you don't use it every day, pack it away!
- Hanging plants are distracting to buyers.
- Get any large animals out of the home.
- Window shades/blinds should be raised 9 inches from the top. All other window treatments should be completely open.
- Have fresh-cut flowers in two areas if possible: Kitchen/dining room table & the master or main bathroom.
- Define each room if the dining room is being used as an office, convert it back into a dining room, etc.
- Don't create a sterile environment- just focus on de-cluttering. You want to focus on uncovering as much floor space, wall space and surface space as possible without destroying the ambience, warmth and charm of your home.
- Make sure there are light bulbs in each lamp and light fixture. Replacing bulbs with new ones will surprise you!

# **Floors**

- Uncover as much floor space as possible without destroying the ambience, warmth and charm of your home.
- Create a 36-inch path everywhere you walk.
- No rugs on carpeted areas.
- Only two light, neutral rugs allowed on the floors, one at the entrance and one at the exit.
- Clean the carpets only if they are dirty. Otherwise, leave the carpet alone if you change the carpet in on room, it will accentuate any negatives of the carpeting in the other rooms.
- No more than 3 or 4 objects on the floor in any room this includes the furniture.
- No furniture in hallways.

# Walls

- Uncover as much wall space as possible without destroying the ambiance, warmth and charm of your home.
- Pictures should be at 60 inches high at the center-eye level for the average person.
- No pictures on the walls in hallways.



### **Closets**


 Pay particular attention to the Master Bedroom closet – nothing should be on the floor (clothes, boxes, etc.).

## **Surface Areas**

- Uncover as much surface area on counters, cupboards, vanities, dressers, coffee tables, etc.
   Without destroying the ambiance, warmth and charm of your home.
- No more than 3 or 4 objects on any surface counter top, dresser, coffee table, etc.
- No objects taller than 9 inches on any surface, unless it is a lamp.
- Bookshelves nothing should be horizontal on a bookshelf, everything should be vertical unless it is a bookend.
- Nothing on top of the TV, commode, stereo speakers, etc.

# **Outside**

- Should be able to walk under each tree without hitting a branch.
- Front door should be in good condition and inviting, neat and clean.
- Shrubs should be trimmed.



# Storage

- All miscellaneous items should be boxed.
- All boxes should be stored in the basement or garage.
- Boxes should be placed around the perimeter of the basement or garage from the floor to the ceiling if necessary.
