## **Tips From Your Home Inspector**

## Why Have Your Home Inspected?



A Home Inspection is a visual inspection of the exterior, structure, roof, garage, attic, basement, plumbing, electrical, heating, cooling, and interior rooms of a home. The home inspection will also include an evaluation of the installed and readily accessible components of the home. The inspection should be made by a trained professional, who has experience in evaluating the features in a house, and who is able to give a clear and accurate picture of the condition of these components.

It is important to remember that a Home Inspection is basically visual in nature, with no intrusive drilling or digging performed. When your inspection is complete, the house must be in the same (or better) condition than it was when you first began.

A Home Inspection has two distinct goals. First, the primary goal of the home inspection is to clearly identify any potential significant defects. Second, is to clearly identify areas in need of repairs/maintenance, or any components that are reaching the end of their useful life span. Even though it is secondary, this area provides very useful information that you will need when setting up your maintenance budget.

A quality Home Inspection, performed by a professional, is designed to provide you with the information you need to make a more informed business decision about your potential purchase. This information will be put in an easy to understand, typed report with digital pictures. You should be able to walk away from the Inspection knowing, clearly, what your immediate major issues are (if any), and what items will need repair and/or maintenance in the near term.

#### Stay Cool This Summer with Preventative A/C Maintenance

You probably don't think much about your air conditioner until it stops working! Before the heat hits this summer, remember to conduct your annual maintenance on your air conditioning unit. Here are some things that you can do yourself to help maintain your air conditioner:

- Ensure the filter is clean and/or replaced regularly. Disposable filters are inexpensive and should be replaced once per month during periods of high usage.
- Trim back plants so there is at least one foot of clearance around the A/C unit. This will allow proper air flow and prevent motor strain.
- Sand and other debris can get sucked into the condenser coils. To clean the coils, first disconnect the power to the A/C and then use a garden hose to spray the coils.
- Check hose connections for leaks and make sure the condensate tube is draining freely.

Preventative maintenance will lower your energy costs and prolong the life of your air conditioner. It is a good idea to have your system serviced once a year by a licensed, certified professional contractor.
